

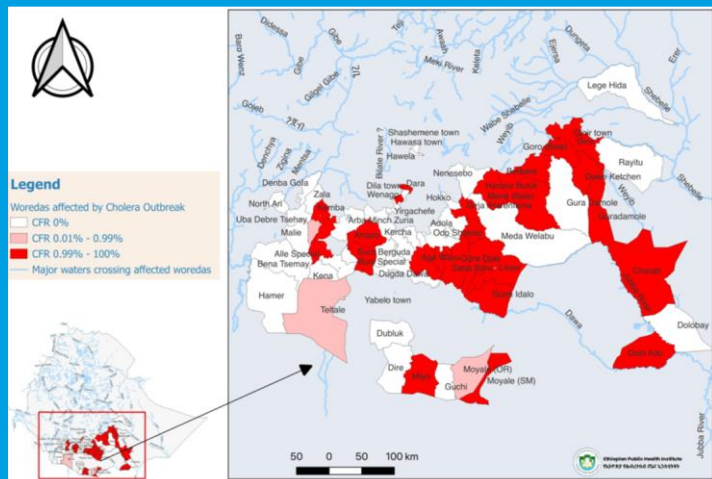
Cholera

Cases as of 18 June 2023	11,407
Weekly increase since 12 June 2023	728
Deaths	156
CFR	1.37% (↓)
Woredas affected	73 (↓)

Highlights

- Cholera cases reported in 73 woredas in 4 regions (Oromia, Somali, SNNP and Sidama). One woreda was declared cholera-free since last week. However, an additional 3 Cholera Treatment Centres (CTC) were established since last week, totalling 83 CTC.
- Slight decrease in Case Fatality Rate (CFR) from 1.44% on 12 June to 1.37% on 18 June 2023. Large discrepancy between regional CFRs with Somali region reporting the highest at 2.1%, followed by Sidama (1.6%), SNNP (1.4%), and Oromia (1.2%).

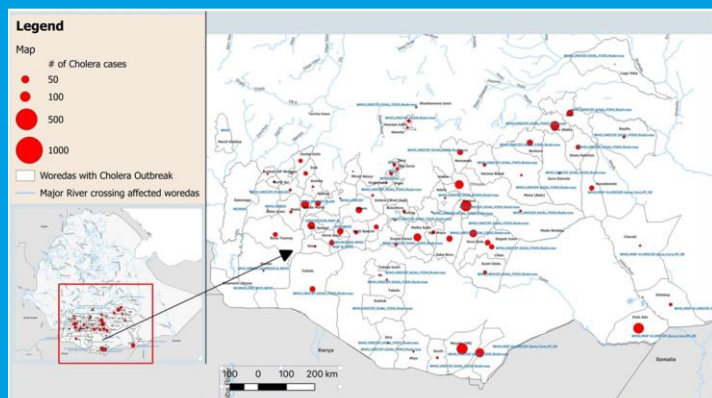
See below map of cholera CFR by woreda



Response

- Stronger focus on community-based approach, involving kebele leaders and community volunteers.
- Second cross-border coordination meeting planned for 28 June 2023 between Ethiopia, Somalia, and Kenya under the auspices of the Intergovernmental Authority on Development (IGAD).
- According to official EPHI data, over 1.9 million people were vaccinated with one dose of Oral Cholera Vaccine (OCV) in 17 woredas: 14 in Borena, Bale, East Bale, Guji and West Arsi zones in Oromia and 3 in Liban and Dawa zones in Somali regions.

Malaria

Cases as of 18 June 2023	1,172,917

Highlights

- Decrease of 22 woredas reporting at least one confirmed case of malaria since 12 June 2023.
- Six new deaths reported, all from Oromia region.
- Cumulatively from 1 January to 18 June 2023, the largest number of malaria cases reported from Amhara followed by Oromia, SNNP and Benishangul regions.
- In the week between 12 and 18 June 2023, largest number of malaria cases reported from Gambella region (643 cases per 100,000 population).

Response

- Focus on monitoring of Global Fund-provided malaria supplies to ensure uninterrupted availability of Rapid Diagnostics Kits, bednets, and malaria treatment.

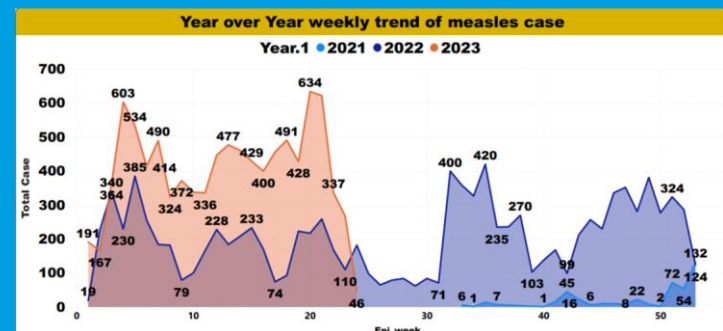
Measles

Cases as of 18 June 2023	20,945
Weekly increase since 12 June 2023	864
Deaths	218
CFR	1.04% (↓)
Woredas affected	55 (↑)

Highlights

- Increase of 8 woredas reporting measles cases since 12 June 2023.
- Significant increase in reported measles cases in 2023 when compared to 2022 and 2021.

Response

- Suboptimal vaccination rates are the key reason for the increase in measles cases: 55.6% of children younger than 5 infected with measles were not vaccinated. A planned measles reactive vaccination is pending awaiting funding availability.
