Tunisia - Wildfires(DG ECHO, media)

EUCPM Activation

- Several simultaneous wildfires have recorded near the town of Tabarka in the North West of Tunisia, since 24 July.
- On 24 July, Tunisia requested assistance from the EU Civil Protection Mechanism in the form of 4 Canadair.
- The rescEU capacity hosted by Spain was mobilised in response to the request, providing 2 Canadair which arrived on 26 July. The mission is expected to conclude today, 27 July.
- The Tunisian Ministry of Interior communicated on 26 July that the fires were contained.



Burkina Faso - Killing of civilians, forced displacement(DG ECHO Partner s)

- On 25 July 2023, Didro, a locality in the commune of Guéguéré (province of Ioba in the South-West region), was at tacked by a non-state armed group. At least ten civilians were killed, three seriously injured and mobile phone ante nnas set on fire. Some residents have left the locality.
- These multiple attacks against the populations lead to the increase in population movements converging to urban a
 nd peri-urban areas, thus accentuating the problem of housing (especially with the rainy season) and access to the
 means of production.
- Since January 2023 more than 187,000 new displacements have been recorded in only three regions of Burkina Fas
 o (Centre-Nord, Sahel, Est) with gaps in the humanitarian response in the sectors of shelter, water sanitation and h
 ygiene (WASH), and education in emergencies.



Uganda - Cholera Outbreak(media, MoH, WHO, UNICEF)

- On 24 July, the Public Health Emergency Operation Centre (PHOEC) notified Minister of Health (MoH) of a confirme d cholera outbreak in Namayingo District, close to the Kenyan border.
- Since 7 July, there are 38 suspected cases, 5 confirmed cases and 7 deaths (of which 2 confirmed cases) in 2 distri
 cts: Kayunga, where a positive case with Vibrio Cholerae Ogawa 01 was confirmed on 19 July, and Namiyingo, confi
 rmed on 24 July.
- A District Rapid Response team is to be deployed in Bumalenge Parish in Namiyingo while on 20 July, a team from Ministry of Health Public Health Fellowship Program was dispatched to investigate the outbreak in Kayunga.

Philippines, Taiwan, China - Tropical cyclone(GDACS, JTWC, PAGASA, Ad DOKSURI, update inet, CMA)

- Typhoon DOKSURI is moving towards south-eastern China after making landfall twice in the northern Philippines, ki lling five people, affecting more than 328,000 and displacing about 27,000 people. On 27 July at 3.00 UTC, its cent re was located over the sea approximately 175 km south-west of Hengchun City, far southern Taiwan, and approxi mately 400 km south-east of the Zhangzhou City area, south-west Fujian Province, China, with maximum sustaine d winds of 139 km/h and gusts of up to 215 km/h.
- China's national observatory has issued a red alert for Typhoon Doksuri, the most severe warning in its four-tier wa rning system, with gale-force winds expected. Taiwan's weather bureau issued wind and rain warnings. Over 5,700 people have been evacuated from flood- and landslide-prone areas in Taiwan's south and east. Fujian, eastern Gua ngdong, and Zhejiang coastal areas, as well as some parts of Taiwan, expect to see heavy downpours of 250 to 40 0 mm.
- DG ECHO partners continue to monitor the situation and assess the emerging needs of the affected people.

II. Europe

EUCPM Activation

- 61 forest fires occurred in the last 24 hours, with the most concerning still in Rhodes, Corfu and Evia islands.
- 10 countries are contributing to the EU Civil Protection Mechanism (UCPM) response to the wildfires in Greece. In t
 otal, over 500 firefighters and 9 planes from the European Civil Protection Pool (ECPP) and from rescEU have been
 deployed.
- The Copernicus Emergency Management Service was activated 7 times in rapid mapping mode (EMSR672 through t o 678 (https://emergency.copernicus.eu/mapping/copernicus-emergency-management-service#zoom=2&lat=50.6 7213&lon=0.35521&layers=0BT00)).



Italy - Wildfires, update(Italian Civil Protection, ANSA, JRC EFFIS)



EUCPM Activation

- According to the Italian Civil Protection, as of 26 July, in the past 24 hours 22 new wildfires have affected southern and central Italy (in particular Sicily, Calabria, Sardinia, Puglia, Abruzzo and Lazio Regions) resulting in further evac uations and damage. Among these wildfires, 12 were contained or fully extinguished. The Italian Civil Protection re ceived 24 requests of intervention of the national fleet, of which 5 remain active.
- In Sicily Island, a number of new wildfires started on 25 July across the Catania Province (eastern Sicily). Accordin
 g to the JRC European Forest Fire Information System (EFFIS), the total burnt area is more than 1,000 hectares. 3
 0 people were evacuated in Nicolosi Municipality (very close to the Catania City area). In Calabria Region, a bakery
 and three buildings were destroyed by fire and 15 people were evacuated people in the area of Strongoli Municipalit
 y (Crotone Province, eastern Calabria).
- Over the next 24 hours, according to JRC EFFIS, the fire danger forecast is expected from high to extreme across t he already affected Sicily, Calabria and Puglia Regions.
- On 27 July, the Italian CP authorities have informed that there is no further need for UCPM support.

Portugal - Wildfires(Catnat, media, FOGOS PT)

- On 25-26 July, one wildfire has been affecting the Sintra-Cascais Natural Park in Alcabideche locality, Cascais Munic ipality, Lisbon District, south-western Portugal, resulting in casualties. The wildfire is approximately 180 hectares. T he wildfire has been contained on the night of 26 July.
- According to media, as of 27 July, 14 people have been injured, including nine firefighters, and 100 people have be en evacuated. More than 600 firefighters, a dozen aircraft and 189 vehicles have been deployed. No damage to ho mes has been recorded.
- Over the next 48 hours, according to National authorities, the fire danger forecast is expected to be high.
